Dear sisters and brothers,

Over the past three weeks I've been writing about stewardship and inviting us all to consider the ways we take care of, organize, and administer the many blessings we've received from God. God is a generous giver and we see this most clearly in that He gave his only begotten Son for our salvation (Jn 3:16). Blessed be the Lord!

In response, I'd like all of us to start thinking now about the coming year. Specifically, how is the Lord calling you to give love, service, time, talent, and treasure in the year to come? The first step is to set aside some personal time to prayerfully talk with God about it. You can ask God questions like: "Lord, what are my gifts and blessings? What would you like me to share with others? Am I being generous in sharing what I've received from your goodness?" After you pray about it, it is important to talk to others about it too. It would be a good idea to talk to your spouse, parents, or trusted friends. Some good conversation starters could be: "What blessings do you think I could share with others? May I share with you the good things I see God doing in your life? Do you think I am giving generously or am I a bit stingy with God and/or others?" Lastly, it's important to make some sort of concrete plan for the year to come. Some examples could be: "I will get involved with ___ ministry"; "I want to meet with Fr. Matt to discuss using my gift of ___ for the good of our Visitation family"; or "We are going to give ___ % of our annual income to support God's work at Visitation".

In conclusion, I am reminded of a poem that hung on a wall in my childhood home that read: "A bell is no bell till you ring it, song is no song till you sing it, and love in your heart isn't meant there to stay; love isn't love till you give it away." Friends, Jesus teaches us that we are happy in this life to the extent that we learn how to make a gift of ourselves in love for others. As you ponder what this will look like for you - personally - in the year to come, you can be sure that I'm doing the same thing...

YEAR OF PARISH REVIVAL JUNE 11 2023 - JULY 17, 2024

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

This three-year initiative launched in 2022 on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi. Renewal began at the diocesan level, inviting diocesan staff, bishops, and priests to what Pope Francis has described as “a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ”—particularly the transforming power and mercy of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

After this fruitful year of preparation, the Year of Parish Revival began on June 11, 2023—also on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. The year has been marked by historic initiatives, such as the first-ever National Eucharistic Pilgrimage. Grassroots creativity is springing up all over the country as love and devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist blossoms in the pews!

Then, on July 17, 2024, America will gather for the first time in 83 years for a National Eucharistic Congress. This historic moment will launch the United States into a Year of Mission, sending on-fire Catholics out to share Christ’s love “for the life of the world.” We will continue to spread the Revival movement throughout the Church’s 2025 Jubilee Year and beyond. 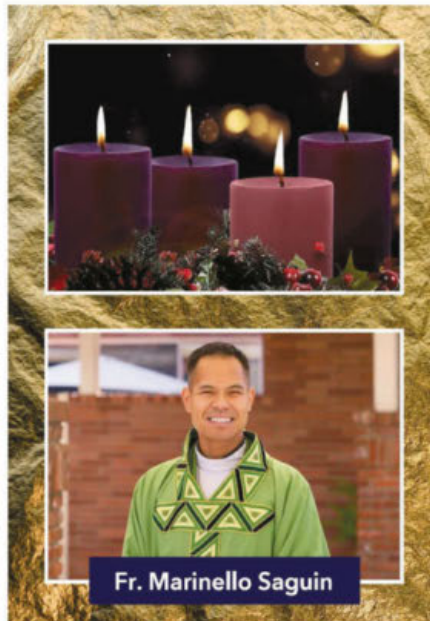

DID YOU KNOW? HOW DO GROOMERS WORK?

Groomers start by picking out a potential victim, often a child who is emotionally vulnerable or isolated, or with low self-esteem. Then, groomers will start to slowly build a relationship — bonding over an alleged shared interest and expanding relationships out to build trust with the victim's family and friends. Groomers work hard to make themselves appear trustworthy and safe, to gain better access to their victims. From there, they can isolate their victims and perpetrate abuse. Prepare your Advent Wreath

Question: What's the story behind the Advent wreath?

Answer: Each season in the liturgical calendar comes with its own local and regional rituals. During the Advent season, wreaths adorn church sanctuaries and family dining room tables. You may have said Advent wreath prayers in childhood or taken a turn lighting the candles. The Advent wreath is full of symbolism about Christ and his coming at Christmas. The wreath is made of evergreen boughs, reminding us that the life of grace doesn't falter with the changing seasons. It always remains fresh and new. Similarly, a circular wreath reminds us of the eternal, never-ending nature of God's love. Candles remind us that Christ is the light of the world, the One who "shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." We use four candles to represent each week of Advent, three purple and one rose. Whatever the color and whatever the day, the Advent wreath is a beautiful practice to focus our attention on Christ's coming at Christmas.

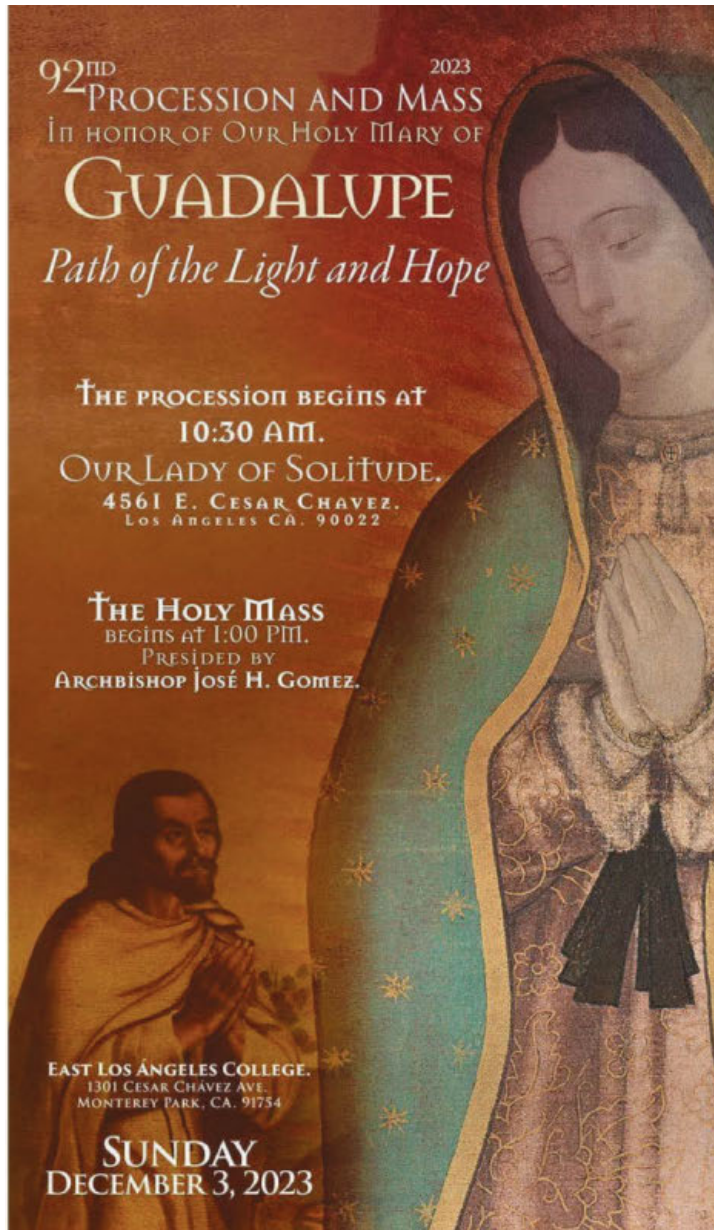

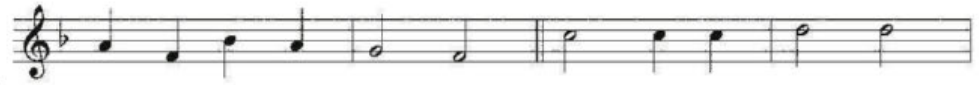
