

Although similar, these two themes are distinct. How so? Monthly Eucharistic Miracle

The Eucharistic Miracle of Buenos Aires

In August of 1996, a woman in Buenos Aires, Argentina, reported that she found a consecrated Host in the church. The priest, adhering to church protocol, placed the host into a glass of water in the tabernacle, so it would dissolve. Days later, the priest was shocked to find the host appeared bloody and had a flesh like appearance. Archbishop Jorge Bergoglio, (now Pope Francis) was notified and had the host photographed, which clearly showed bloodied flesh that had somehow grown larger than the original Host. It was then placed back in the tabernacle for 3 years. Incredibly, it never decomposed, which is virtually impossible to explain, because there had been no effort to preserve it. Consecrated hosts typically fully disintegrate within several days.

In 1999, Archbishop Bergoglio officially opened an investigation and brought in an atheist, named Castanon Gomez of Bolivia to spear-head the investigation which included 8 scientists from 4 Continents.


The experts, without knowing where the sample came from, issued their results, concluding that it was human flesh and blood. Moreover, world renowned cardiologist and forensic pathologist, Dr. Frederic Zugibe of Columbia University, said that it was "a fragment of the heart muscle found in the wall of the left ventricle close to the valves." In addition, it was concluded that "the heart had been under severe stress, as if the owner had been beaten severely about the chest."

Perhaps most fascinating about the findings, Dr. Zugibe said, "The heart muscle is in an inflammatory condition and contains a large number of white blood cells. This indicates that the heart was alive at the time the sample was taken. It is my contention that the heart was alive, since white blood cells die outside a living organism."

Dr. Zugibe was so puzzled at the presence of the white blood cells (because white blood cells disintegrate after 15 minutes when blood is drawn) that he demanded to know who this sample belonged to. When he was informed it was a consecrated host, he was speechless for five minutes.

The presence of white blood cells was naturalistically impossible, and this was truly a Eucharistic miracle.

By the end of the investigation, Castanon Gomez had converted to Catholicism.






