



PARISH POST MAY 7, 2023

Dear brothers and sisters,

BEEEEP! The workday begins with the annoying clamor of an alarm clock which we scramble to silence - at least for a moment - by hitting the snooze button a few times. But we cannot cling to sweet slumber forever and so inevitably we roll out of bed, rush to get ready, fill our mugs with coffee, and jump in the car only to be greeted by the humm humm of LA traffic. Frustrated, we inch our way along until finally we get to work - a few minutes late of course - and then plop ourselves down to take a breather when before we know it a healthy dose of daily drama inundates the confines of our personal safe space. Between pit stops in the breakroom, staff meetings, and distractions we are lucky to get one hour of productive work done when all of a sudden it is time to jump back into the car, suffer more LA traffic, and rush from one evening commitment to another. We get home exhausted and feeling guilty for all the work left undone we seek refuge in mindless television. Somewhat deflated we turn out the lights, hit the hay, and begin the whole cycle again... such is the modern experience of work!

Perhaps I exaggerated a bit, BUT I do believe that most people see work more as a curse than a blessing; a necessary evil that must be endured for the "greater good" or something like that. However, from the beginning it was not so and the feast of St. Joseph the Worker (May 1st) is meant to rehabilitate such distorted notions and restore work to its rightful place in the goodness of God's creation.

Chapter one in the Book of Genesis reminds us that humans were not made for work, but that work was made for human beings. God made Adam and Eve in his image and likeness and commanded them to cooperate with him in the cultivation of the world. Far from being a curse, work offers humans the opportunity to become more and more like the one in whose image they have been made. In the Biblical account of creation it is important to notice that the toil of work was a consequence of sin and not a part of God's original plan. In the post-fall world in which we now live, it is the toil of work that tends to grab our attention and that disfigures our understanding of the original dignity and goodness of work.

With the feast of St. Joseph the Worker, we remember that St. Joseph worked hard as a carpenter and Jesus Christ, for the first thirty years of his life, worked with St. Joseph. Jesus "entered into work" and his own work and toil sanctifies the work and toil of us all. When we unite our work to that of Jesus it becomes a graced reality for our holiness and union with God. Does Jesus take away the difficulties and challenges of work? No. But he allows us to face them with hope that work done with love - no matter how mundane or monotonous - becomes an occasion for us to pass through the cross to the glorious heights of heaven.

Have a blessed week and let's take seriously this call to stop seeing work as a distraction from God and see it for what it truly is: an opportunity for encounter and transformation.






