PARISH POSTAPRIL 2, 2023

Dear sisters and brothers,

You know that sense of accomplishment you feel when you check something off your to-do list? Or the sense of pride that comes when you finally reach your goal after prolonged effort and inching your way forward little by little? Well, this past week I had one of these moments when I finished reading the entire New Testament. Since my college days I've had the habit of reading the Bible everyday, specifically the New Testament. But here's the catch - I only read for about three minutes (yes, three minutes, not two or four minutes). What this means is that in any particular sitting I don't make much progress; maybe a chapter at the most. But it is amazing how reading 3-minutes everyday adds up after a while. So much so that I finish reading the New Testament every eight or nine months. Once I finish it, I start all over again and so at this point in my life I've read it about 12 times or so.

Reading the Bible everyday has been so good for my relationship with Jesus and I highly recommend it for all of you. When I first started, I would try to read for 15-20 minutes. I soon found myself unable to stay faithful to this commitment. Eventually, I decided to decrease the time to three minutes. I found that decreasing the time was not a loss but an overall gain because it allowed me to read just enough to ponder for the day. Reading the Gospels helps me get to know the life of Christ - his parables, teachings, and attitudes - and they challenge me to incorporate them into my life. It's fascinating to read about the early Church in the Acts of the Apostles or the missionary activity of St. Paul in his Letters and I'm inspired to follow in their footsteps and to be bold in living my Catholic faith. Friends, it's amazing how a few minutes per day can make such a difference to build us up in faith, hope, and love.

As Lent concludes and we enter into Holy Week, I encourage you to fill your hearts and minds with Sacred Scripture - you won't regret it! If you have a Bible, go find it. If you don't have one, you should buy one. I suggest this small copy of the <u>New</u> <u>Testament</u> because it is easy to carry with you while you're on the go. It is even broken down into short daily readings which come out to about three minutes per day. You'll get through it in no time. I'll leave you with a quote from St. Josemaría Escrivá who said, "How I wish your bearing and conversation were such that, on seeing or hearing you, people would say: This man reads the life of Jesus Christ" (*The Way*, #2).

"As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another". Proverbs 27:17




