Dear sisters and brothers,

Over the course of the next few weeks I'd like to begin a Parish Post Series on Stewardship. The word stewardship invites us to consider the ways we take care of, organize, and administer the many blessings we've received. In the Gospels, Jesus tells various parables about stewardship (i.e., Luke 16:1-9 or Matthew 25:13-40). In these parables, Jesus calls us to receive and give with generosity.

In the first place, our faith in Jesus calls us to grow in love and a joyful willingness to reach out to others with love. In his First Letter, St. John writes: "We love because he first loved us" (1 John 4:19). With these words we are reminded that God is the first mover and takes the initiative to reach out to us in love. God does this in His Son, Jesus, who offers His life for us on the cross and invites us to new life in the Resurrection. We are called to receive this love - to accept it. We receive this love most powerfully in prayer and receiving the sacraments with regularity and proper disposition (especially confession and communion). In this way, we are filled with God's abundant love which allows us to go forth and share that same love abundantly with others.

Years ago, I remember helping with campus ministry as a college student at USC. In the beginning it was great! I loved serving my fellow college students in a diversity of ways. But after a while, I found it burdensome and exhausting. I felt drained and depleted. It wasn't until someone said, "You cannot give what you don't have," that I understood my dilemma. In truth, I had things backwards. I was trying to share God's love without first taking time to receive God's love and in the end my "well ran dry."

This week, let's reflect on how God is calling us to be stewards of His love. Are we receiving God's love in prayer and the sacraments? Are we sharing God's love with others?

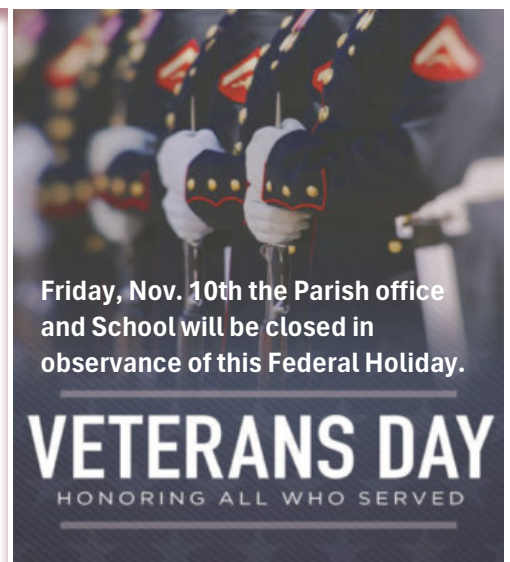

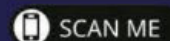

DID YOU KNOW? KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE IN SPORTS

Every adult has the responsibility to make sports a safe and enjoyable experience for children. Playing sports helps children work on sportsmanship, goal setting, personal responsibility, and emotional control. But sports also include some risks — the potential for physical injury, bullying, hazing, and even abuse. Because sports happen outside of “normal” school hours, there may be less safety checks than there are in school. Parents need to be vigilant in confirming that coaches and volunteers are vetted, and that their children are playing in safe environments. National Vocation Awareness Week is an annual week-long celebration of the Catholic Church in the United States dedicated to promoting vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life through prayer and education, and to renew our prayers and support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations.

NVAW began in 1976 when the U. S. bishops designated the 28th Sunday of the year for NVAW. In 1997, this celebration was moved to coincide with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which falls on January 13 in 2013. Beginning in 2014, NVAW was moved to the first full week of November.

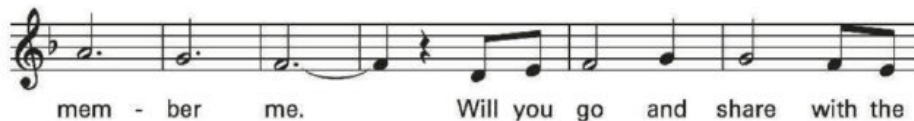

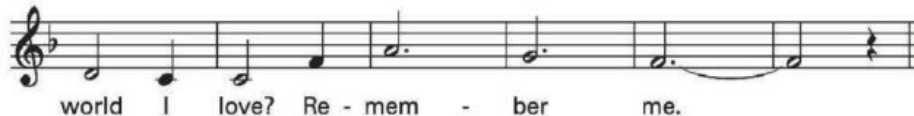
