

#### **PARISH POST**

Dear sisters and brothers,

A couple of weeks ago, I spent a day at the Getty Museum. I was inspired to go after reading an article in the Angelus about a new exhibit entitled "Giacomo Ceruti, A Compassionate Eye". In this exhibit, Ceruti presents powerful portraits of beggars, vagrants, and impoverished workers. Walking the gallery, I realized that Ceruti was not putting the tattered clothes, worn faces, and desperate circumstances of the poor on display as yet another call for political action to remedy the perennial problem of poverty. More than this, by choosing to paint them he was pulling them out of the peripheries and acknowledging their dignity and worth. That although oft-forgotten, they too are our sisters and brothers.

October is Respect Life Month; a month when we especially remember that no one is to be relegated to the peripheries and forgotten. Indeed, life is a gift that comes to us from God and we are to receive and nurture this gift from the "womb to the tomb". Since the beginning of his pontificate, this is a message that Pope Francis has preached tirelessly. In fact, just last week he promulgated an apostolic exhortation in which he points out that the climate crisis is "a global social issue and one intimately related to the dignity of human life" (Laudate Deum, par. 3). Clearly, everything we do is either building up or tearing down a culture of life and love - even the choices we make in caring for the environment.

This week, I invite you to pray: "Who needs to be pulled out of the peripheries in my life? Who's dignity have I discarded and forgotten? Who can I welcome back into my life?" These are good questions to ponder as we all recommit ourselves to care for and respect the world in which we live and the lives of all those God has entrusted to our care.





#### DID YOU KNOW? PROTECTING VULNERABLE ADULTS

While a primary focus of those in ministry is on protecting children from harm, protecting vulnerable adults is just as important. This includes adults living with mental, emotional, or physical disabilities, adults who have court-appointed guardians, elderly adults in vulnerable positions, and anyone else who may be unable to consent to or understand what is happening to them. Every year, nearly 500,000 reports of abuse against vulnerable adults are made to the Adult Protection Service, and even more go undetected. The same steps and processes outlined for protecting children can help vulnerable adults as well — know the warning signs, screen all employees and caregivers, and monitor environments for safe practices. 




#### APOSTLES CREED




