SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Heavenly Father, in my times of trial deliver me from all doubt and distress through the enduring presence of your Son through the grace of the Holy Spirit.

My brothers and sisters,

As Lent begins, we as a parish enter into a time of prayer especially for the choice of a new pastor or administrator. At all the masses this past Sunday, we prayed together our prayer of discernment for a new pastor, as we will at all of our masses, both daily as well as on Sunday. Likewise, our school will join in, as each of the classes will be praying this same prayer for the wisdom of God to be upon our church leaders as they select for us a new priest to pastor our community. I hope you all have received a prayer card at mass last week, but if not, I included the prayer below and invite you to pray it daily. The archdiocese should be announcing a decision sometime around Easter.

I know that this is a time of uncertainty. And I know that as a parish, many of you have grown tired of one administrator after the other, and must be wondering what will be coming next. I invite you to look a few years back in time for an answer to that question. Remember when we started Renew Visitation together, and our parish goal seemed the absolutely impossible \$3.5 million? Many of us (sometimes myself too!) wondered if we could ever reach such a summit? And remember how we not only reached it but exceeded it and raised \$4.5 million? Look at all the ways in which our parish has prospered through the years. Our school is as vibrant as ever, the parish looks beautiful, and the church receives so many compliments. We all did such great work together. Then we received not just one, but two young priests to serve our parish. Other communities would die for such a blessing. I think of **Psalm 124: "Was not the Lord with us?" Most certainly he was and has been throughout the years.**

So, to answer the question of "what's coming?" Something wonderful. Something that is exactly what our parish most needs.

VIOLENT CONFLICTS

QUESTION:

What is the Christian attitude towards violent conflicts?

ANSWER:

In the Beatitudes, Jesus teaches us "Blessed are the peacemakers" and to "love your enemies." All human beings are made in God's image and likeness. We are one human family — brothers and sisters despite what divides us. Christians have the obligation to prioritize peaceful means to resolve conflicts. War wreaks a toll on a nation. Civilians bear a disproportionate burden of this cost during the war itself and as the nation rebuilds. However, those in authority have the obligation to protect the innocent.

During the gradual fall of the Roman Empire, theologians began to theorize that war could be just if it was a defensive measure of last resort. The "Just War Theory" was later expanded by St. Thomas Aquinas, who also included moral obligations during the war itself, including the protection of civilians. Those in public authority have the obligation to carefully examine their motives, agendas, and rationale for violent force. Should a cause be just, those who fight and defend under such circumstances must be valued and honored. They deserve our support both during and after the war.

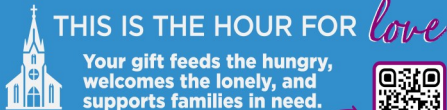

Mission Circle #10 ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

Mission Circle #10 has been in existence since **February of 1951**. We are one of the three remaining mission circles in the archdiocese. Our membership has fluctuated from a high of around 25 in the 1950's and '60's to now 7 members. The purpose has remained the same: to help the poor of Pakistan. We send funds to a missionary in Faisalabad, Pakistan, along with Mass intentions; also funds to support a midwifery school for young women and to the nuns who operate the school, to help keep their convent in running order.



In the beginning, in the 1950's, The Society for the Propagation of the Faith, under the direction of Msgr. Brouwers, went to the parishes of Los Angeles to ask women, usually housewives with little or no income, to come together in "Mission Circles" and dream up ways of funding our brothers and sisters overseas – or even in the United States – to join in spreading our faith. In Visitation Parish, Virginia O'Neil started our circle. The founding members paid dues of \$1.00 a month and raised money by holding yard sales, bake sales, luncheons and even dinners. Our missionary at the time was Father Reginald, an Italian Dominican priest. We helped to build a church, school and hostel for orphaned boys in Renala Khurd and adopted a girl orphan until she was able to care of herself. We corresponded with Father Reginald, who sent letters back describing the situation and needs of the people of Pakistan. After he retired for health reasons, we continued to correspond with many missionaries over the years: Bishop Frank Cialeo, Bishop Paul Andreotti, Fr. Isaac Immanuel, Fr. Samuel George, Fr. James Archangeles, and Fr. George Ibrahim, who was murdered in his rectory on July 5, 2003. Fr. Abraham was succeeded by his assistant, Fr. Samson Peter, who was later replaced by Fr. Bashir Francis, at his parish of the Holy Rosary in Lahore. Fr. Bashir has since retired but lives with other priests in a home for the elderly priests of Pakistan. They receive a stipend from our Mission Circle for saying Masses for our intentions. We correspond by email these days and have a quicker response time but we know that our donations are still appreciated.

On Saturday, March 14th, Mission Circle #10 will celebrate our **75th anniversary** and would like to invite the people of our parish to join us at the 8 a.m. Mass, followed by a reception in the O'Grady Center. Five staff members from the Pontifical Mission Office are coming to present us with a certificate honoring our 75 years of service. We are honored to accept this certificate. All of our current members will be present and we would love if you would join us and see pictures of some of the people we have supported over the years and some of the parish members of decades past.

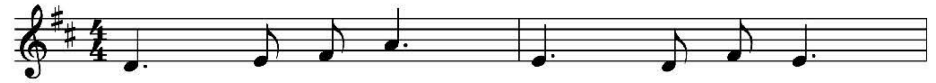
