

# PARISH POST

Dear sisters and brothers,

I recently read the book entitled, How Will You Measure Your Life, by Clayton Christensen. Dr. Christensen (1952-2020) was a professor at Harvard Business School and was named one of the world's most influential business thinkers in 2011. It is a fascinating read that applies lessons learned in the business world to helping one live a meaningful life. I recommend it.

One of the points he makes refers to priorities and how we often fail to invest in what's most important until it is too late to do so; a situation he refers to as "planting saplings when you need shade." His argument goes like this: existing companies with a strong business model resist investing in future opportunities for growth because they'd rather use that money to expand their current strategy which seems to be working pretty well at the present moment ("if it ain't broke, don't fix it!"). But what these companies fail to realize is that if they don't invest now in new growth opportunities for the future, then the day will come when their current business model becomes obsolete and at that point it will be too late to invest in new growth opportunities. "The ship will have already set-sail" and they won't be able to keep up with the competition.

We do something similar when it comes to our personal lives. Dr. Christensen writes:

"Many of us thrive on the intensity of a demanding job - one that we believe in and enjoy. We like proving what we can do under pressure. Our projects, clients, and our colleagues challenge us. We invest ourselves in our jobs. But in order to accomplish all this, we start to think of our jobs as requiring all our attention... Work becomes how we identify ourselves... and we expect the people who are closest to us to accept that our schedule is simply too demanding to make much time for them. We find ourselves forgetting to return emails and phone calls from friends and our families; neglecting birthdays and other celebrations that used to be important to us... You might be hoping that the bonds of your friendship are strong enough to endure such neglect, but that's seldom the case... People in their later years in life so often lament that they didn't keep in better touch with friends and relatives who once mattered profoundly to them."

I suppose his point is that if we don't invest in the relationships that are important to us now, the day will come when we truly need these cherished people but by that time they won't be there. We'll be left alone and we can't turn back the clock.


Friends, let's not take our loved ones for granted. Let's not wait until it's too late to invest in these important relationships. Instead, let's invest in them NOW! Summer is a great time to deepen existing bonds of love and friendship. Let's ask the Lord to guide us in living our priorities now while looking with hope to the future.
