



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

On March 18th at 7pm in the Church we will have our annual Lenten Reconciliation Service. This is an opportunity for all of us to humble ourselves, confess our sins, receive God's abundant mercy, and prepare ourselves for new life in the Risen Lord this Easter. I hope you can make it!

To help you prepare here are some quick answers to common questions:

1. **Why confess to a priest when I can go straight to God?** Only God can forgive sins so we should go to God many times/day asking for mercy and forgiveness when we mess up and sin. However, when Jesus (God) rose from the dead he deliberately chose to share His power to forgive sins with his Apostles (cf John 20:22-23). The Apostles exercised this power to forgive sins and passed it onto their appointed successors (bishops/priests). Here we see the biblical and apostolic foundations of the sacrament of reconciliation and our current practice of individual confession and absolution. So if Jesus established this sacrament, then it only makes sense that he would want us to use it!
2. **How often should I go to confession?** The second precept of the Church states that we are to confess our sins at least once/year (Catechism #2042). So no matter what, everyone should go to confession at least once/year. One should also go to confession if conscious of having committed a mortal sin. Along with many other priests, I encourage people to go to confession once/month whether or not they have committed a mortal sin. Confession keeps us humble, strengthens us against future temptation, and helps us catch small sins which can easily snowball into larger ones. Plus, we usually get helpful encouragement advice from the priest which is always nice. Keep in mind that the great saints (i.e., St. John Paul II, St. Mother Teresa, St. Josemaria Escriva) would go to confession weekly because they wanted to stay as close as possible to God. We should all learn from their holy examples and go to confession regularly.
3. **How should I prepare for confession?** Before going to confession you should take time to pray and examine your conscience. Check out this helpful resource: <https://www.ncregister.com/info/confession-guide-for-adults>
4. **Can the priest share what he hears in confession?** Absolutely not. A priest must keep the *seal of confession* and cannot share what he hears in confession with anyone (even law enforcement). If a priest breaks this seal by connecting a sin with a particular penitent he will be automatically excommunicated which can only be lifted by the pope himself.

I invite you to take this week to thoughtfully prepare for going to confession on March 18th. Be not afraid! Each confession is a new beginning and an encounter with the merciful love of our Father God.


Sharing the Gospel


