PARISH POST

Dear sisters and brothers,

The week after Easter I enjoyed some days back in Minnesota visiting my family (check out the photo of some of us at the zoo!). Like many of you, my parents are loving the show called, The Chosen, which is about the story of Jesus from the eyes of his followers. While home with them, I was able to sit back, relax, and enjoy a couple of episodes from season 3 with them. I found it quite intriguing and something from episode 2 caught my attention and I'd like to invite all of us to reflect on it this week (spoilers!!).

Episode 2 concludes with Jesus announcing to his apostles that he will be sending them out two-by-two with power to heal and cast out demons (cf. Mark 6:7ff). The reaction of the apostles is fascinating. They resist and don't want to go saying, "What's our message going to be?... We don't have enough training!... It's dangerous and how can we survive if we don't take food!?" With loving compassion Jesus listens but ultimately challenges them to see that their fulfillment of this mission will require that they rely totally on God and the generosity of others. In short, Jesus' invitation is one of radical trust and complete dependence on divine providence.

While the Gospels are silent on the matter, I appreciated the interpretive lens of the show on this point. Like all of us, the apostles were also human, right? They too had weaknesses and shortcomings, right? They too had to engage in the tough but graced work of holiness, right? The answer is a resounding YES! But unfortunately, we forget that, and our reading of the Gospel can become somewhat stoic and divorced from human experience. All too often we can be led to believe that because the apostles were chosen by Christ, it must have been easy for them. But the truth is that they struggled just like we do, and, in this way, they become powerful examples for us.

As Bring a Friend to Mass Weekend quickly approaches, perhaps you've felt like the apostles. Maybe you've wondered, "Who am I to invite someone else to Mass?... No one will take my invitation seriously... what if I'm rejected and they say no?" My friends, as disciples of Jesus he invites us to trust him and take up the mission of being his witnesses in the world despite our imperfections. So do not worry. The key is that we strive to do our best and then abandon everything into the hands of God, our loving Father.

I missed you all while I was away and it's great to be back home on Visitation. I'm looking forward to an awesome Bring a Friend to Mass Weekend as we welcome our brothers and sisters back to their spiritual home. My love and prayers are with you this week as you personally reach out to others and invite them to join you at Mass.

MEN'S CORNERSTONE RETREAT




"As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another". Proverbs 27:17



APOSTLES CREED




