

PARISH POST

Dear sisters and brothers,

The other day, one of our parishioners spoke to me after Mass and shared that she was carrying a heavy burden. She was suffering intense physical pain that left her wondering how this fit into God's plan for her life. She wanted to know *why* this was happening to her. I listened and my heart grieved - we prayed.

As you can imagine, these sorts of questions come up regularly in my priestly ministry. In moments of heartbreak, pain, or suffering people are moved to turn to the Lord and ask, "Why?" It is a good question and ultimately one for which we will not receive a 100% satisfactory answer until we are in heaven and can ask God for ourselves. Nonetheless, I have found consolation on one insight from our Catholic Tradition rooted in Scripture and the story of creation.

I suppose God could have created a perfect world free from suffering and pain. In this world everyone would make the right choices, say the right things, and live in harmony. But in this "perfect" world something valuable would be missing: freedom. You see, the perfect world described above is not a human world, but the world of robots. It is a world in which we are God's pre-programmed machines; not His beloved children. It is a world bereft of love because love demands freedom. One can only be "chosen and loved" in a world where one can also be "rejected and abandoned." The risk of love is freedom and with that freedom comes the possibility of pain, suffering, and evil.

Some have asked, "If God is all-powerful, then could he make a rock so big that he couldn't lift it?" The answer is, "yes." The rock so big that God can't lift it is the rock of free-will. God who is love (1 John 4:7) desires a relationship of love with you and me and he gave us free-will precisely so that we would use it to love him in return. As we celebrate the 4th of July this week let's reflect on the gift of our personal freedom and whether we are using it to truly love God and neighbor so as to build the Kingdom of Jesus.
